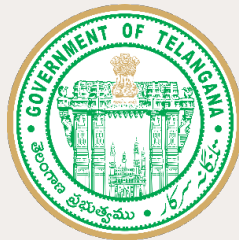
HERITAGE PARTNER SCHEME

Built in 1800s, in the Koti area area of Hyderabad which has been shaped by the British Residency, this structure originally was the residence of the Parsi businessmen brothers, Pestonji and Viccaji Meherji. Subsequently, it was sold to the family of Raja Narsingh Gir ji, a Kayastha business family who served the Nizams of Hyderabad. Similar to other structures in the area, the structure exhibits European style of architecture within an open garden setting.

Over time, many historical structures in the area were repurposed for public uses, including institutional and healthcare. Since 1955, the Government ENT Hospital has been operating from this structure, it is one of the oldest specialty hospitals in India.
