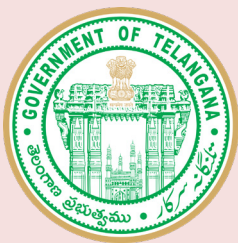
A monumental stepwell built during the reign of the Kakatiya dynasty, the locally known, "Shringara Baavi" in Shiv Nagar was constructed in the 11th century by the Kakatiya rulers.

The well is built across three levels: the first level from the bottom was used for bathing, the second level had rooms for changing clothes, and the third level was designed for performing rituals. Legends say that Rani Rudramma Devi would use the stepwell for her daily ablution, earning it the name "Shringara Baavi."
