HERITAGE PARTNER SCHEME

The Taramati Baradari, believed to have been constructed around 1625, is situated atop a hillock along the Golconda-Gandipet Road.

The monument is traditionally associated with Taramati, a celebrated courtesan of the Qutb Shahi court during the reigns of Sultan Abdullah Qutb Shah and Sultan Muhammad Qutb Shah. Its elevated setting affords sweeping and picturesque views of Golconda Fort and the city of Hyderabad



About the Building

The baradari is an arched pavilion raised on a high platform rising nearly 150 feet above the surrounding terrain. The structure is constructed primarily of stone and lime mortar and follows a symmetrical architectural layout. The principal façade is defined by five distinct Qutb Shahi arches, while the interior comprises a series of interconnected arches supporting a domed ceiling executed with squinches.

Approach to the pavilion is series of platforms and stairways, alternating staircases with five and twelve steps, which are interpreted as symbolic.

Taramati Baradari has been integrated into a heritage resort and cultural tourism initiative, transforming it into a destination for visitors seeking a blend of history, leisure, and performance arts experiences. Modern construction around the historic site houses auditoriums, banquet halls, meeting rooms, restaurant, bar, swimming pool, shops and hotel.

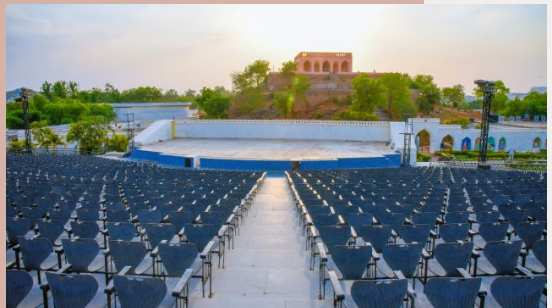
Indo-Islamic Qutb Shahi architecture, characterized by simple symmetry, arches, and functional ornamentation rather than heavy decorative elements.



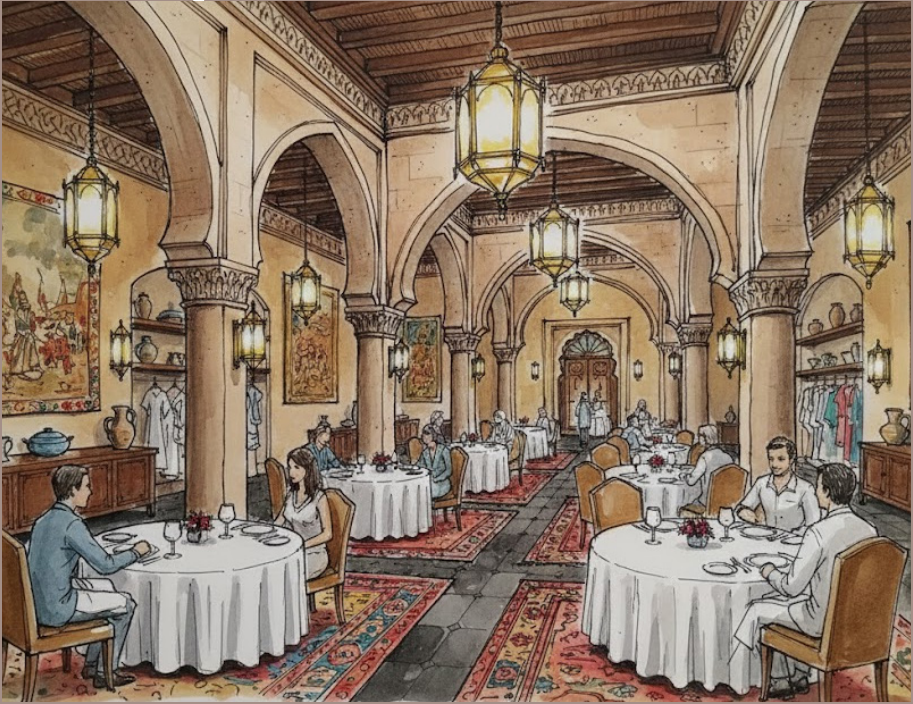
The structure is a rectangular, multi-roomed pavilion with a central hall and side rooms, organized around open terraces. The building is long and narrow, reflecting its function as a stage and resting place for performers.



Perched on a hill, the pavilion uses the natural slope to provide scenic views of Hyderabad and Golconda Fort, enhancing its status as a leisure and performance venue.

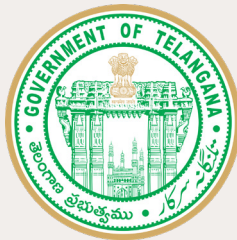
