HERITAGE PARTNER SCHEME

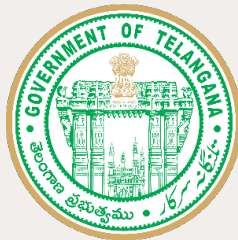
The Wanaparthy Samsthanam was under the rule of the Raja of Wanaparthy, a vassal and feudal lord of the Nizam of Hyderabad. It was one of the three important samsthanams in Telangana, the other two being Gadwal Samsthanam and Jatprole Samsthanam.

The Palace, also known as Mustafa Mahal, was built in a blend of European and Indian architectural styles in the early 20th century and served as the residence of the rulers of Wanaparthy Samsthanam.





The K.D.R. Government Polytechnic College (KDRGP) in Wanaparthy was established in the Palace by Late Sri Raja Rameshwar Rao of Wanaparthy Samsthanam and inaugurated by India's first Prime Minister, Pandit Jawahar Lal Nehru, on October 11, 1959. It was the first polytechnic college in Telangana, and the Raja donated his palace and land for the college's establishment.
